

MAP Testing Information

MAP (Measures of Academic Progress) is a computer-adaptive test, administered three times each school year. It takes approximately 50-60 minutes per student. You can test many students at one time, depending on how many computers or other devices you have available. The tests are given once in the fall, once mid-year, and once in the spring.

Subjects tested are Math and Reading. Student results are available within 24 hours of testing and all reports are available online. All students in grades K-8 can be included, or whichever grades you choose.

The cost is only \$12.50 per student per year. That price includes all three testing periods. If you are interested here is what you need to do:

1. Let Vicky Lauritzen know you are interested right away.
2. Send Vicky a list of how many students you will test in each grade level by August 25.
3. Send a check made out to CCC for \$12.50 times the total number of students. Send this also to Vicky by August 25.
4. We will put you in touch with Martha Havens at Pacific Union Conference, and Dr. Keith Drieberg at La Sierra University, who will provide more instructions.
5. At some point you will need an Excel spreadsheet with all student names and grade levels.
